Also with this new era, a process of change, improvements and updating began for the *Revista Cartográfica* to comply with the multiple requirements demanded by indexes and databases to advance in indexing processes. After many changes, work and dedication, the *Revista Cartográfica* has been indexed in the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ) and in SciELO México.
